Meet the patient

Lucy had a bicycle accident 10 years earlier causing her left central incisor to break off at gum level. She has been experiencing problems (swelling and infection) at this site for a year and has been told she needs to have the tooth removed. Lucy is feeling confused by the mountain of information she has received as well as the different options open to her and feels unable to evaluate the situation in order to arrive at a decision.

Meet the patient

Hannah's job involves contact with clients and since her denture has loosened she feels less confident about smiling, which has had an impact on her work. She is considering having her 15-year-old bridge removed in favor of implants. Hannah was previously told that she would need two bone grafts, due to severe horizontal and vertical bone loss, which shocked her. She is now looking for a more permanent solution that includes natural-looking gums and is hopefully less invasive.

When patients are at risk for peri-implantitis, what do they need to know in order to take a decision before they receive their implants? And what if they are already suffering from peri-implantitis?

How to promote compliance and avoid any possible further impact by explaining the treatment options, materials and steps to patients who are at risk.



Meet the patient

Claire has two implants that were placed 15 years ago. She is feeling frustrated as she has had a number of peri-implantitis-related problems that resulted in what she felt was quite extensive treatment three years ago. Claire is hoping for a permanent fix – trying to understand the options open to her and wondering why the peri-implantitis has returned. The cost of repeated treatment is also a factor.
