

WEDNESDAY, MAY 20TH @ 12 PM EDT WEBINAR: RESEARCH PRIORITIES IN LESS THAN 30 DAYS: HOW TO SUPPORT HEALTH SYSTEMS RESPONSE TO COVID-19

The COVID-19 pandemic is pushing the age-old challenge of moving evidence into action quickly to its limits. This webinar will highlight a recent innovative effort to quickly identify, prioritize and publicize the most pressing questions health systems have in response to the pandemic. AcademyHealth President and CEO Dr. Lisa Simpson, Kaiser Permanente Northwest Center for Health Research Director Dr. Lucy Savitz, and Senior Scientist with the Palo Alto Medical Foundation Research Institute Dr. Harold Luft will explain how their team brought together dozens of leading experts from across sectors and led them through a collaborative process that resulted in a consensus-based research agenda. They will also highlight key health system priorities including issues around health equity as well as data and measurement. The webinar will conclude with reflections on the importance of collaborative science and questions for attendees to weigh in on in response.
